Int: Tony Molloy RIP & Vincent Bennett RIP	We know what the two disciples on the road to Emmaus spoke about on their journey because Luke himself has given us the context and content of their conversation. When the stranger came and began to walk alongside them, asking them what it was that was so troubling them, they were somewhat taken aback. As a result, they told him the account of the life of Jesus and of his passion and death, having no idea it was Jesus they were speaking to and conversing with. It was only when they reached the village and went into the inn, that they came to recognise who the stranger was. The action which opened their eyes, was the breaking of the bread, which leads one to assume they must have been present at the Last Supper. But what happened on the way back? Have you ever wondered what they spoke about then or did they remain silent, gobsmacked by what they had experienced? Their hearts we of course aglow, kindled by the effects of what the risen Jesus had said and done, and it seems perfectly plausible that their minds were racing with the imagery of all that he had told them. They couldn't wait for the moment when they were together again with the other disciples so that they could tell them all that had happened. It was in the midst of all the reality of telling them what they had experienced that Jesus became present once more. The community was gathered, and within that gathering Jesus appeared. A meal was prepared, and scripture discussed, and its meaning unfolded and within that preparation and unfolding, Jesus appeared. It is in the repetition of these events, the coming together, the preparation of a meal and the unfolding of the scripture that the presence of Jesus is made manifest. This is the sacrament which we now partake of today in our gathering, in our preparedness and in our unfolding of the texts which focus on his reality. This is the aftermath of the Emmaus journey, and it remains and stays with us. The great theologian Hans von Balthasar was once asked just where did Jesus go when he vanished from the

Being Christian is not first of all a doctrine or a moral ideal; it is a living relationship with him, with the Risen Lord: we look at him, we touch him, we are nourished by him and, transformed by his Love, we look at, touch and nourish others as brothers and sisters. May the Virgin Mary help us to live this experience of grace.
